He is an organizational economist primarily interested in understanding how skill heterogeneity impact organizational performance. He is the author of numerous books and articles on his topics of interest. His works have been published in the B.E. Journal of Theoretical Economics, Econometrica, and Management Science, among others.

He got a MRes in Economics and a PhD in Economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science.
